Broomfield teams with the Broomfield Chamber to expand business offerings.

Broomfield – The City and County Workforce Development and Economic Development Departments have opened a satellite office at the Broomfield Chamber of Commerce to expand its business services in partnership with the Broomfield Business Resource Center.

The 7,000 square foot center is complete with training rooms, professional meeting, and work space, and executive office space for businesses to locate, expand and grow in Broomfield. This extension of services builds on one of the goals of the Mayor and City Council to have business recruitment, retention, marketing, and partnerships efforts within the City and County.

CNN Money magazine poll ranked Broomfield County 15th in the country for emerging job growth. This comes to no surprise to Mayor Pat Quinn, “The dedication to cultivating a strong business community runs deep in our city’s core values with our pro-business climate, high quality workforce, and a spirit of innovation found in Broomfield.”

The City and County of Broomfield, the Small Business Development Center, and the Business Resource Center offer a one stop shop of business services and will focus on:

- Business outreach and programing, focusing on the economic development plans seven strategic priorities including supporting the creation of and sustainability of business and fostering and environment of entrepreneurial growth;
- Helping entrepreneurs and small businesses navigate the City licensing and approval process;
- Clearinghouse for real estate and labor market information including property availability, employment trends and labor force availability and requirements to help employers make informed hiring and business location decisions;
- Provide workforce development services to Broomfield’s professional job seekers and primary employers related to in-demand positions such as software engineers and other professional jobs;
- Provide Broomfield companies and job seekers a comfortable environment to fill professional and management level jobs in partnership with the workforce center.
