### **Question 2A**

Proposed Backyard Chicken Ordinance No. 1965. This is a livestock ordinance that allows chickens in single family residential areas, absent specific zoning provisions, subject to the following restrictions: no more than five chickens per residential lot, roosters are prohibited, chickens must be contained within a coop and enclosure, chickens may not be kept in a front yard, coops and enclosures must be set back a minimum of ten feet from the property line, and outside slaughtering is prohibited. Building permits are required for coops and enclosures six feet or greater in height or coops greater than thirty-two square feet. A license from the City and County of Broomfield Department of Community Development is required. Covenant-controlled communities may further restrict or prohibit backyard chickens. The ordinance establishes penalties for violations in accordance with chapter 1-12 of the Broomfield Municipal Code.
