



What to do with items on the NOT ACCEPTED LIST?

| Liquid waste of any kind (including paint, peanut oil, fryer oil, etc.) | Solid waste landfills do not accept liquids. Liquids, including latex paint and fryer oil, may be solidified with kitty litter or saw dust. Once all the liquid is absorbed and dry, the waste can be bagged and put in with the regular household garbage for pick-up by your regular trash company. |
| Any single item that is too big or too heavy to be lifted by two people | These items can be dismantled into smaller manageable pieces and placed at the curb before 7 a.m. for Spring Cleanup. If you miss that opportunity, you are responsible to take them directly to a landfill or arrange for special pick-up with your regular trash hauler for a fee. (See other side for landfill locations and phone numbers) |
| Any appliance with a Freon unit, such as refrigerators, freezers, and air conditioners | Freon is hazardous and requires handling by a state-certified operator. Local trash haulers will pick up items containing Freon for a fee (usually \$25). Contact your trash company for specific information. |
| Tires | Most tire retailers in Broomfield take used tires for a minimal fee of approximately \$5. Contact the tire retailer to request the fee per tire. |
| Cars and car bodies | Go to http://www.donate-car-for-charity.com and fill out donation form, or call toll free: 1-800-992-2383. They pick up. Vehicles donated on this site benefit a non-profit classified with the IRS as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization, and items are tax deductible. |
| Any items listed as a hazardous material; any corrosive, flammable, reactive, or combustible materials (including ammunition*); pesticides, herbicides, car batteries, antifreeze, motor oil, radioactive materials or pharmaceuticals | <p>Broomfield's HHW drop off day is May 14, 2011 by appointment only. Call 303.438.6334 to schedule an appointment. If you are not available on May 14, Broomfield residents can use the regional HHW drop-off facility in Boulder. Contact 720.564.2249 for additional information.</p> <p>Motor oil can be brought to Broomfield's waste oil collection site at 3001 W. 124th Avenue (just east of Lowell Blvd.). Tuesday – Friday, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. or the first Saturday of each month, 8 a.m. to noon.</p> |
| Propane tanks from barbeques | Check in the Metro Denver Yellow Pages under "GAS-Propane." Most of the companies will take old propane tanks. Some charge a nominal disposal fee, and others recycle them for free (MetroGas, 790 W. 64 th Ave., 303.428.3036 recycles for free) |
| Concrete, concrete pavers, soil, sod, grass clippings | Items should be delivered directly to a landfill (See other side for landfill locations and phone numbers) |
| Tree limbs or tree stumps less than 12" diameter, shrubs | Tree limbs less than 12" diameter may be recycled at the Tree Recycling drop-off at 225 Commerce Street on Wednesdays from 1-5 p.m. and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. |
| Sealed containers or drums larger than 5 gallons | Contact your regular trash hauler for specific instructions. Note: see liquid waste above. |
| Business, commercial, industrial or agricultural waste | The Spring Cleanup program is for residents only. Businesses must contract individually for garbage collection. |
| Household trash | Residents must contract individually for curbside pickup of regular household garbage. Check www.Broomfield.org for a list of licensed trash haulers in Broomfield. |
| Fire Extinguishers | Integrated Safety Services (I.S.S.) 303.278.1538 or look in the Yellow Pages under Fire Extinguishers. |
