June 2010 Report**

Statistical Report

- Circulation is maintaining a 9% increase over 2009
- Reference activity is strong at a 6% increase for the year
- Internet use appears to be tapering off for the summer months
- Express-check circulation stations are now handling 70.3% of circulation

Program & Service Highlights

- Summer Reading Program is in full swing. Registrations as of today total: Children – 3,203; YA – 981; and Adult 690. Registration ends July 17th.
- The movie nights have been very popular. Next year they will all be held in the Audi as the Eisenhower Room showings reached capacity early.
- The Children's Department sponsored a workshop for area librarians and educators titled, "Building Cooperative Behavior" in partnership with the Imagine! group.
- The Young Adult Department hosted a full schedule of varied programs from sushi to stilts.
- Summer Reading prizes for teens included tickets for box seats for the Modest Mouse concert at the 1st Bank Center.
- English language classes are on a summer break, but the other adult classes and tutoring continue, including 21 computer tutoring sessions.
- The 1st floor exhibit cases features a display on cooking utensils from the Depot Museum.
- The circulation area Art Wall is quite successful with exhibits already scheduled into 2011.
- Credit card payment at the circulation desk and Audi box office will be possible later this summer. Installation and staff training has begun.

Building & Grounds

- Solar arrays will be installed on the library roof and grounds this summer.
- The flower pots are back (!) along the library front entry.

Administration

- Boulder Public Library Director, Tony Tallent, resigned effective July 9th.
