

Internet Safety

The Broomfield Police Department has been a member of the [Colorado Internet Crimes Against Children](#) (ICAC) Task Force since 2006. The ICAC Task Force program was created to assist state and local law enforcement agencies in responding to internet and computer-facilitated crimes against children. 45 regional task forces were formed and funded by the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. These task forces were mandated with developing additional participating agencies, or satellite agencies, within their region as the number of regional task forces was capped at 46.

The Colorado ICAC Task force was formed in 1998 by the Colorado Springs Police Department and the Pueblo County Sheriff's Office, and was one of the original 10 task forces formed. The Colorado ICAC Task Force currently has 31 member agencies, and an additional 25 participating agencies within the state of Colorado.

Task Force agencies respond to reports of internet-facilitated crimes against children, and provide agencies with the means to conduct proactive investigations through ongoing training provided to law enforcement. The ICAC Task Force program also promotes community awareness and education in the areas of Internet safety for children and the prevention of the sexual exploitation of children.
