

Questions and Answers About The Willmaker Legal Seminar

Q: WHAT IS THE COST TO ATTEND THE WILLMAKER SEMINAR?

A: *The cost is \$99 per person, \$198 per couple. The cost of a will is usually \$500 or more per person if prepared individually in an attorney's office.*

Q: HOW LONG DOES THE WILLMAKER SEMINAR LAST?

A: *The class itself usually takes about three hours. The instructor remains available for a limited time after class to review documents and for assistance.*

Q: HOW MANY PEOPLE CAN ATTEND A SEMINAR? CAN ANYONE ATTEND?

A: *Class size ranges from a minimum of 5 up to a maximum of 25 people per session. Participation is limited to Colorado residents who are over the age of 18 and of sound mind.*

Q: WHAT WILL EACH PERSON LEAVE THE CLASS WITH?

A: *Each person will leave the class with a complete, notarized and witnessed will. Other optional documents completed in the class include: Living Will, Financial Power of Attorney, Medical Power of Attorney, and Organ Donor Registry Form.*

Q: WHAT INFORMATION SHOULD BE BROUGHT TO CLASS?

A: *You just need a general idea of what you own. You should also bring the names and birthdates of your children, and the names of people you would like to appoint to care for your children and handle your estate. Finally, it is a good idea to give some thought before class as to what burial or cremation arrangements you would like to specify in your will, if any. You do not need to bring account numbers, policy numbers, or other details about your assets.*

Q: CAN A HUSBAND AND WIFE WRITE A JOINT WILL?

A: *No. The class requires each person to write a separate will. This is because, under existing state and federal law, joint wills are no longer considered advisable.*

Q: SHOULD MARRIED COUPLES COME TO CLASS TOGETHER?

A: *Attending together can be helpful since spouses may want to confer during class about decisions concerning family matters. If only one spouse can attend, the other spouse can usually make arrangements to attend a later seminar. In that case, it is a good idea to discuss family matters prior to the first class.*

Q: IF I DON'T WANT TO PREPARE A WILL, MUST I STILL PAY FULL TUITION?

A: *Yes, each person attending the class must pay full tuition. The Willmaker Program is an educational program which includes a great deal of useful information. This policy is necessary to insure that the lowest cost for this program can be maintained for everyone.*
