H2O Jo and Flo are our Stormwater Quality Ambassadors. Remember to follow these simple steps to help protect stormwater runoff:

Pet Waste

Pet waste contains harmful bacteria that can end up in our local waterways; and it is not fun to step in it either. **Scoop the poop!**

Lawn & Garden

Leaves and grass clippings can decompose and take the oxygen out of water, harming aquatic life. Fertilizer from your lawn can run into our streams causing bacteria and algae to grow in the water.

Pick up grass clippings and leaves and use fertilizer sparingly!

Vehicle Maintenance

Antifreeze is very toxic to people and animals. 1 gallon of motor oil can contaminate up to 1 million gallons of water. **Recycle used motor oil and dispose of antifreeze properly!**

Storm Drain Marking Program

Why is this an important program? Because stormwater runoff that flows over impervious surfaces like driveways, sidewalks and streets can pick up pollutants along the way which are discharged into ditches, creeks, ponds, wetlands or streams **UNTREATED**.

Clean water is necessary for drinking, recreation, agriculture and aquatic animals. By reducing the pollutants that enter our storm sewer system, we enhance our water quality.
