Rain Barrel Workshop - It's about to go down. Colorado Water Law now allows residents to capture rainwater for use on their lawn and garden. Each residence can have 110 gallons of rain barrel storage. Learn how to install your own rain barrel.

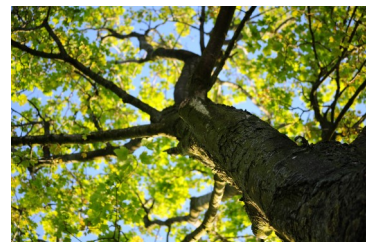
MARCH

Designing a Xeriscape Yard - This class provides the skills needed to prepare a new landscape design or redesign an old one, to conserve water and save money. Learn low-water use landscape ideas to reduce lawn areas, create useable spaces, and enhance visual appeal of any yard.
