Stumped on what to do during Colorado's Stay-at-Home mandate? Try this list of fun activities to help keep you occupied as you practice staying at home and social distancing! To give yourself even more of a challenge, try to do at least one activity each day until you've completed them all.

- Re-read a book you haven't read in over a year.
- Try a family member or roommate's favorite book.
- Watch a movie with subtitles . . . for an extra challenge, try a foreign language film!
- If you're able, check out the [Front Range Downloadable Library](#) and explore the world of eBooks.
- Read a book from your shelf that has an orange or yellow cover (even if you have read it before).
- Dust off one of your cookbooks and test out a new recipe (or try a new recipe from online).
- Finally get around to reading that book you received or bought a while back.
- Read a graphic novel or a comic strip.
- Fill out a Mad Libs form and read it aloud dramatically. The more drama, the better!
- Read the first page of your favorite book aloud to a pet, family member, or an open window.
- Make up your own silly short story with someone else and then read it out loud together, preferably while making funny voices and faces.
- Call a family member and read them a favorite poem or ask them to read you one.
- Write or record a one-minute review of a book you loved or hated and share it with a friend.
- Design an alternative cover for one of your favorite books.
- Write a letter to a character from your favorite book.
- Wash your hands while you sing the chorus from your favorite song . . . remember, the ideal hand-washing time should last at least 20 seconds!
- Look through your bookshelves and sort out books you would like to donate, then organize your books however you would like . . . sorting by colors of the rainbow can add fun visual appeal!
- Have a book discussion with your friends or family (either in person or online, depending on whether your reading buddies live in the same household as you).
- Make an illustration that represents your favorite book and see how many people you share it with can guess the title of the book.
- Play a game that can be done on your own, like Solitaire.
