



Volunteer Position: Nature Program Volunteer

Position Description: Nature Program volunteers deliver hands-on programming to a variety of ages, but mostly to preschoolers and their parents. Programming usually includes: family sunset & moonlight walks, preschool nature walks and kid's classes.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Lead hands-on programming for a variety of ages, mostly preschoolers and their parents
- Assist with program tasks, school field trips and educational booths as needed
- Volunteers are asked to assist with a minimum of one nature program per month
- Create a volunteer profile in VolunteerHub, complete a background check, attend any required training and record all volunteer hours on a monthly basis
- Represent the City and County of Broomfield in a professional manner in keeping with Broomfield policies

Qualifications:

- No experience necessary. Ages 18+. Training is provided to new volunteers
- Good communication/public speaking skills
- Confidence leading young children and parents, especially small group management
- Ability to work with minimal guidance
- Available to lead programs on weekdays
- Comfortable leading programs during mornings or evenings as necessary
- Must have own means of transportation, a computer and a telephone
- Ability to stand for up to two hours at a time, bend over and move objects under 15 pounds

- Increased knowledge of the outdoors
- Self-growth from training and interacting with experienced naturalists
- Experience leading small groups and educating youth
- Promote environmental stewardship with the younger generation
- Be with individuals who share their love of nature
