FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer transportation?



Yes. Easy Ride, operated by the City and County of Broomfield staff, is a transportation service for seniors 60+ and for disabled residents. Easy Ride provides wheelchair-accessible transportation and receives funding from Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG). Please call 303-464-5534 for more information.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer a lunch program?*

Yes. Lakeshore Café at the Community Center offers nutritious and delicious meals Monday through Friday at noon. A Healthy Hearts meal is offered the first and third Wednesday of the month. Reservations are required and can be made in person or by calling 303-426-5526.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer Meals on Wheels?*



Yes. Any adult age 60+, at any income level, who is homebound and/or lives alone, and is unable to prepare meals for themselves is eligible for this service. Family caregivers, residing in the same home, also qualify for meal service. Individuals under the age of 60 may qualify with a medical referral. Fresh, hot, nutritious meals are delivered to the home by volunteers, Monday through Friday (frozen meals are available for Friday delivery for weekend meals). Short-term and permanent service is available. Scheduling of meals is required. To schedule, please call 303-464-5532.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer any kind of recreation activities or fitness classes?



Yes. Through Broomfield's Recreation Department, there are a wide variety of activities including exercise and fitness options, special events, drop-in activities, Healthy Hearts Walking Program, SilverSneakers® and more. I am a caregiver and I don't know where to begin to look for help -

The Caregiver Respite Program, offered by Broomfield Senior Services through grant funding received from Denver Regional Council of Governments (DRCOG), provides services to caregivers. For more information about this program and additional caregiver resources, please call 303-464-5529.

Does Broomfield Senior Services host any support groups?

Yes. There are several support groups meeting at the Broomfield Community Center. They are offered at no cost and do not require pre-registration. Please call 303-464-5526 for information.

Does Broomfield Senior Services provide assistive equipment such as wheelchairs and walkers?



Yes. We have a loan closet available for Broomfield residents 60+ to borrow equipment on a temporary basis. Inventory changes from day to day and we DO NOT carry any items related to the toilet for sanitation reasons. Please call 303-464-5526 for more information.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer a handyman program?

Yes. The focus of the program is to help seniors live safely and independently in their own homes by providing assistance with minor home repairs and safety modifications. Services are provided by skilled volunteer handymen. Please call 303-464-5529 for more information.



Does Broomfield Senior Services offer foot care services?*

Yes. We offer two choices for foot care. Podiatrist, Scott Taylor, DPM, provides basic foot care including nail clipping the second Wednesday of each month. Appointments are available between 9 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. by calling 303-464-5526. Fee: \$26.

The Visiting Nurse Association provides a Wellness Clinic the third Tuesday of each month from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Services are provided by registered nurses and include health history and assessment, blood pressure check, and foot care. Call 303-698-6496 to schedule an appointment. Fee: \$30. Your visit may be covered by your insurance if you have a qualifying Kaiser Permanente insurance plan.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer financial assistance for personal needs?*

Broomfield Senior Services does not offer financial assistance, however, our staff can advocate for your needs by acting as a liaison with various charitable and non-profit organizations. Qualifications apply. Please call 303-464-5529 for more information.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer a driving education program?

Yes. We host the AARP Smart Driver Course, a one day, 4 ½ hour education program in a classroom setting; no actual driving will take place. Pre-registration is required. Please call 303-464-5526 for more information.

Does Broomfield Senior Services offer any kind of income tax services?



Tax preparation assistance is provided during tax season by AARP volunteers at the Broomfield Community Center by appointment only. Please call 303-464-5526 for more information.
